As Board Chair of the Seneca CEO Program, I am filled with immense pride and gratitude as I reflect on the accomplishments of this year's class. Though small in number, this group of four remarkable students exemplified the spirit of the CEO program in every way — through their leadership, generosity, and entrepreneurial drive.

Together, they achieved a record-breaking class profit of over \$6,500 — the highest to date. But what made this class truly exceptional was not just what they earned but how they chose to give. In a display of maturity and community-mindedness well beyond their years, they reinvested a portion of their earnings to enhance the prizes for grant and pitch competitions, then donated 75% of the remaining profits to Tiffin Parks & Recreation. The final 25% was thoughtfully reserved to support next year's CEO class. Their actions perfectly captured what it means to be a CEO student — building a business for a greater purpose.

Throughout the year, we've watched these students grow into confident, capable young professionals. They've challenged themselves, embraced feedback, built strong local connections, and proven that they are more than ready to be leaders in whatever path they choose next.

As a board, we are honored to support this program and humbled by the impact we see year after year. This class, in particular, has left a lasting mark — not only on their own futures but on our community.

To our facilitator, our investors, and to every business and mentor who poured into these students: thank you. And to our students — thank you for reminding us why we do this.

Serving as the facilitator for this year's Seneca CEO class has been a true privilege. Over the course of the year, we engaged in 48 business visits and welcomed 15 guest speakers from across the county. These experiences represented a wide variety of industries and business sizes, each offering unique insights and valuable lessons that shaped our learning journey.

Though our class was small, they were mighty in their achievements, earning over \$6,500 in profit, the most of any class to date. Their entrepreneurial mindset was matched by a spirit of generosity: they used a portion of their funds to increase grant and pitch competition prizes, then chose to donate 75% of the remaining profits to Tiffin Parks & Recreation and reserve the remaining 25% to support next year's class.

I could not be more proud of the four students who made up this cohort. They've grown tremendously in their communication skills, business acumen, and professional networks. As much as they learned from the program, I found myself learning just as much from them.

It's been an honor to help guide these young entrepreneurs and see firsthand the impact of the CEO program in our community.

CEO S'MORES

WHERE LEARNING MEETS DOING



OPERATION

CEO S'mores was born from a collaboration between Operation Hallmark, a local nonprofit, and Tiffin Parks & Recreation. Together, they introduced the Sutton Bank Rink at Oakley Park for the 2024-25 winter season, and the Tiffin community eagerly anticipated this iceless skating rink. Operation Hallmark and the parks department asked the CEO class to sell s'mores at the rink to enhance the family-friendly experience. The class's role expanded when they were asked to manage and train volunteers, receiving half of all rink admissions in return.

Students prepared s'mores kits containing graham crackers and marshmallows in plastic bags with their logo sticker. Customers chose between Hershey's, Reese's, and Milky Way chocolate, with all sales including a bamboo skewer. Sales were processed using a borrowed Square terminal at the rink admission booth.

Students rotated shifts for opening, closing, and volunteer training while manning sales during spare time. CEO S'mores operated from December 8, 2024, to February 2, 2025.

For advertising, students used social media, wore neon beanies with the CEO logo, collaborated with the Seneca Regional Chamber's ribbon-cutting ceremony, distributed flyers at Tiffin's tree lighting ceremony, and spoke at the event.



FINANCIALS

The CEO students sold s'mores kits for \$2 each or two kits for \$3. Some of the materials for the s'mores kits were donated by local businesses, including the graham crackers, Hershey's chocolate, bamboo skewers, plastic bags, and a plastic sealer. Purchased materials included marshmallows, Reese's, Milky Way, and logo stickers. Other expenses included the logo beanies and Square processing fees. For agreeing to be managers, the students also earned half of all rink admissions.

Total expenses were \$502.30, and total income from the two revenue streams was \$6,257.50, resulting in a total profit of \$5,755.20.
